 Send copies of documentation you already have or request copies from your school or provider.
 Alternatively, have your diagnosing

professional fill out the *Disability*Verification and *Recommended*Accommodations form provided by

Accessibility Resources.

What are Accommodations?

By removing or minimizing disability-related barriers, accommodations can create a playing field that's level with students who do not have a disability.

Steps in becoming registered:

- Make an initial appoinment with an Accessibility Representative
- Provide medical documentation from a VA hospital and/or medical/mental health professional, supporting your diagnosis
- Attend a registration appointment with an Accessibility Representative
